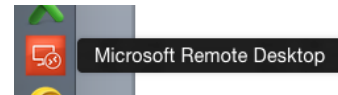


Connecting via UVM Wireless or from off-campus.

Microsoft Remote Desktop

If you are not connected to the network via Ethernet or you are off-campus and you want to access your department's shared drive or your own files on your H: drive, you will need to use a piece of software that essentially emulates a Windows computer and creates a secure connection.

Find Microsoft Remote Desktop in your Applications folder or click on the shortcut in your dock, if there is one. If you do not have the Microsoft Remote Desktop App, please either contact the Helpdesk by submitting a footprint or visit the Apple App Store (under the Apple Menu) and search for Microsoft Remote Desktop. The APP is free, but you need to download it with your own Apple ID. Look for the software with the orange icon.



When you start the App, you'll see a screen like the one below. It will most likely be black. To create a desktop connection, click New and enter the following information:

Connection Name: COM REMOTE
PC Name: remote.med.uvm.edu
Username: med\your user name - Make sure you include the med\
Password: Your password (the new one)

In order to be able to save files you are working with within Microsoft Remote Desktop to your computer, you'll need to do the following:

1. In the Edit Remote Desktops window, click the redirection button then click the + button near the bottom of the Redirection palette.
2. Locate the Path pull-down menu and select browse. It will open a Mac Finder window that you should use to point to your Home folder.
3. Select the Home folder on your Mac and click choose.
4. Then close all of the windows.
